- f. Environment Committee

The Sustainability Commissioner presents the Environment Committee Report. They state that the Committee was quite successful this semester: their aim was to function as an independent club and be a support system for sustainable initiatives on campus. They identified that outreach and communication were issues among the existing initiatives. Their aim was to promote sustainability in student groups and initiatives, and bring together resources for these groups. They created a Slack channel to share resources and share events, which was constantly being updated with new events and projects. The Committee created a smaller Environment Committee Executive, which worked on procedural and administrative matters, including outreach, graphic design, discussion topics, and more. The Executive was made up of students, and they did most of the administrative work. Their meetings shifted to bi-weekly, and they updated other members through Slack. They established a sustainability corner on the listserv, which is a continuous process. They did a trivia night at Gerts, discussed the Climate Justice Policy and sent in a request to edit it. They discussed the moratorium on fossil fuel investments, and they do not want to renew the moratorium. They advertised sustainable

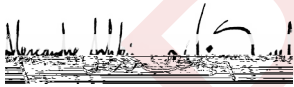
